



Among The Nation's Best

University of Iowa student-athletes are recognized among the very best this nation has to offer. Michelle Edwards ended her junior year as a Kodak District V all-American and began this season as one of only 12 players named to Street & Smith's pre-season all-America first team. Edwards is the first Hawkeye to ever earn all-America status, as well as all-Big Ten honors twice. Last summer, 1987 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Franthea Price, joined Shanda Berry on the gold medal-winning U.S. entry to the Jones Cup Games in Taiwan. Berry also joined former Hawkeye Lisa Becker on the U.S. Select Team which competed in Korea.

IOWA vs. NORTHWESTERN

Today's Game Sunday, January 10, 1:30 p.m. Carver-Hawkeye Arena

Today marks the opening game of yet another exciting season of Big Ten Conference basketball to be played in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.


"Exciting" hardly describes the pre-Big Ten portion of Iowa's 1987-88 schedule. The Hawkeyes have jumped out to the best start in school history, 9-0, a mark which includes wins over five top ten teams.

Last week, the Hawkeyes captured the Burger King/Orange Bowl Classic championship with wins over Texas, Auburn, and Virginia, teams which ranked one, two, and six on the national polls.

Hawkeye fans have certainly been a good luck charm for fifth-year coach C. Vivian Stringer and her Iowa teams. The Hawkeyes have lost only two Big Ten contests on their home court with Stringer at the helm. Both losses were to Ohio State during the 1984 and 1985 league seasons. The most recent defeat was overshadowed, however, by an amazing Hawkeye accomplishment, as a record 22,157 fans filled Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Feb. 3, 1985 to see Stringer and her troop come within nine points of the nationally-ranked Buckeyes.

Winning 34 of 36 conference games played in Carver-Hawkeye Arena is quite a feat. Equally impressive is the fact that aside from the two Buckeye wins, no Big Ten team has come within 10 points of the Hawkeyes during a Stringer-coached contest on Iowa's home court.

The Hawkeyes enter today's contest with a slim 7-6 series lead over Northwestern. Last year, Iowa swept the series 72-61 in Evanston and 70-53 in Iowa City. The Wildcats' most recent win over Iowa came in Stringer's first season as a Hawkeye, 1983-84, with a 59-51 victory at Evanston.



Don Perrelli Wildcat Head Coach

Fourth-year Wildcat head coach Don Perelli was named Big Ten Coach of the Year last season after guiding Northwestern to a third-place league standing and its second-ever NCAA tournament berth. The Wildcats finished the year 20-9 overall and 12-6 in the conference. In post-season action, the Wildcats grabbed a 62-61 overtime win against Kansas State before falling in the second round to Louisiana Tech, 82-60.

Iowa opened Big Ten Conference round robin play, Fri., Jan. 8 at Wisconsin, while the Wildcats opened at Minnesota.

Earlier this week, Iowa became the first Big Ten Conference team and only the tenth team ever to rank No. 1 on the nation's basketball polls.

HAWKEYE SPOTLIGHT

Jolette Law 5-3, Sophomore, Guard Florence, South Carolina (Wilson High School)

Iowa items: Jolette Law, Iowa's pesky 5-3 point guard, has emerged as the coolheaded quarterback of the Hawkeye offense. Despite her small package, Law has proven she can run, score, and rebound with the biggest and the best. The sophomore recorded a career-high scoring mark, 18, as she helped pace Iowa past Auburn in the opening round of the Burger King/Orange Bowl Classic. Law compiled 45 points in Iowa's 3-game quest of the classic championship, a performance which landed her a spot on the all-tournament team.

Last Year: Saw action in 17 games as a rookie... top game came against Michigan State when she hit two of two shots from the field, grabbed a steal and handed out an assist in only six minutes of play... recorded season-bests in rebounding against Minnesota (2), assists at Wisconsin (2), steals at Drake (2), and blocks against Purdue (1).

High School: A four-year letterwinner in basketball, she received honorable mention all- America honors from USA Today following her senior year at Wilson High School... also was named on Street & Smith's pre-season high school all- America list... earned all-state honors from The Greenville News and the South Carolina Coaches Association in both her upperclass years ... a four- time all-conference pick, she earned conference most valuable player honors as a senior . . . averaged 23 points, 7 rebounds, 6 steals, and 4 assists per game her final prep year ... graduated with Wilson High School career records in points scored (1,812) and assists (552)... an excellent track athlete - a four-year letter-



winner and former state champion in the long jump — she owned conference records in the long jump (19 feet, ½ inches) and triple jump (38 feet, 5 and ¾ inches) upon graduation.

Personal: One of three children of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Law of Florence, S.C... pursuing a degree in physical therapy.

HEAD COACH



C. Vivian Stringer

In only four years, The University of Iowa basketball program has risen to the height of national prominence. Guiding this tremendous growth is an extremely talented coaching staff led by head coach C. Vivian Stringer, the only coach to lead the Hawkeyes to 20-victory seasons and into post-season competition.

The Hawkeyes' dynamic head coach begins her fifth season as a Hawkeye with a remarkable career record of 336-81 (.806), a mark that includes a four-year record at Iowa of 85-30 (.739) and a 57-15 (.792) ledger against Big Ten Conference opponents.

An examination of the Hawkeyes' performances year by year under the former head coach of Cheyney State College clearly reveals the development of one of the nation's most respected programs. Stringer's first Iowa team, the 1983-84 squad, won 17 games, two more than the previous two Hawkeye squads had won total.

In 1984-85 the Hawkeyes reached the 20-victory plateau for the first time in school history. The 1985-86 squad continued the upward trend by winning 22 games — including a school record 15 versus Big Ten opponents. That squad also received an atlarge berth to the NCAA tournament, another first for the Iowa women's basketball program. The 1986-87 team took this success one step further with Iowa's first NCAA tournament victories over New Orleans and Georgia and tied for the first-ever Big Ten championship. Iowa won an unprecedented 26 games, 17 against Big Ten foes.

Stringer's presence in the Hawkeye state has resulted in unprecedented success in two other significant areas.

Iowa is firmly established as one of the nation's leaders in attendance and currently boasts the NCAA record for attendance at a single game as well as the three highest-attended games in Big Ten history. The Hawkeyes ranked among the top ten in women's national basketball attendance figures in 1986-87 and recorded the highest regular-season, single-game figure.



1986-87 marked the second season in Iowa history that the Hawkeyes were ranked among the nation's top 20 from start to finish. The Hawkeyes ended the season ranked seventh by the USA Today and ninth by the Associated Press.

Stringer was named the NCAA Division I Coach of the Year honor in 1982 and the NCAA District V Coach of the Year in 1985. She coached the United States to a silver medal in the 1985 World University Games in Kobe, Japan, following the 1984-85 season.

Also an active administrator, Stringer was instrumental in the development of the National Women's Basketball Coaches Association. She currently is a voting board member of the Amateur Basketball Association of the United States of America and the Nike Shoe Company Coaches Advisory Board. In 1987, Stringer begins a three-year appointment as the Big Ten Conference's representative to the NCAA Division I Mideast Basketball Committee.

A native of Edenborn, Pennsylvania, and a member of the Alumni Hall of Fame at her alma mater, Slippery Rock State College, Stringer is married to William D. Stringer. The couple have three children, David, Janine, and Justin.





Jennifer Bednarek

Entering her fifth season as assistant to C. Vivian Stringer is Jennifer Bednarek, a former all-America guard at Penn State University.

Bednarek came to the Iowa program from Wichita, Kansas, where she was assistant coach for the Wichita State women's basketball team. She coached at WSU for two years following a two-year stint as graduate assistant coach at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Illinois.

Bednarek's coaching talents have gained national recognition, making her a highly recruited prospect for many of the top Division I head coaching positions throughout the country.

A starter for three years at Penn State, Bednarek led the Nittany Lions in scoring three consecutive seasons and at one time held ten PSU records. She was named to Kodak's all-East, all-America squad her final two seasons.

Marianna Freeman

Continuing a long and prosperous association with C. Vivian Stringer is Marianna Freeman, who is entering her fifth year as assistant coach of the Hawkeyes. Freeman was coached by Stringer while she attended Cheyney State College in the late seventies. She captained the 1979 Cheyney State team that was unbeaten in 25 games.

Freeman was head coach at Delaware State College the two seasons prior to coming to Iowa. Under her direction, the DSC program moved from the cellar of the Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference to the league's upper division.

Freeman is not only a successful coach, but a proven administrator. Under Freeman's direction, the National Youth Summer Sports program at Deleware State rose from the bottom of the national rankings to among the top ten of its kind in the country.








OPPONENTS BEWARE

The words "Home Court Advantage" certainly apply to the Iowa Hawkeyes and Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa has won an astounding 48 of 53 games played in the arena since C. Vivian Stringer took over as head coach. Most incredible was Iowa's 1986-87 14-1 record within the arena's friendly confines. Perhaps the most memorable of these were the 66-54 victory over league-leading Ohio State before the nation's largest regular season crowd, 10,159, and a regional television audience, and Iowa's first-ever postseason victory, 68-46, over New Orleans in the second round of the NCAA tournament.

CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA



Carver-Hawkeye Arena is the site for all of the Iowa women's basketball team's home games as well as the location for the Hawkeyes' outstanding weight training and sports medicine facilities.

Located on the western edge of campus, the \$18-million structure is the largest addition to what has developed into one of the nation's finest athletics complexes. Within walking distance of the Arena are the Iowa Baseball Field, the Hawkeye Softball Complex, the UI Recreation Building, Kinnick Stadium and its adjacent 16-court tennis facility, Finkbine Golf Course, the Iowa track, and the Indoor Practice Facility.

In addition to providing a competition site for basketball, volleyball, wrestling and other selected events, the Arena houses offices for the athletic department's coaches and administrators, locker rooms, weight training and medical care rooms, wrestling workout and locker rooms, and several team, press, and meeting rooms.


